# LAMG Annual Meeting, Luncheon at Maryvale

On June 1st, Maryvale hosted a luncheon for the Los Angeles Maryvale Guild. This event provided an opportunity for members of the Guild to gather, connect, and learn more about the incredible work being done at Maryvale. As part of the day's activities, the Guild members were given a guided tour of our beautiful campus including a tour of our Early Education Center and Seton House.

Guild members had the chance to see firsthand how the impact of the Guild's support is providing critical and transformative programs to the children and families we serve. The luncheon included a presentation of Maryvale's remarkable history, an update of where we are today, and a look into the future. The Luncheon concluded with a performance from the children in the Early Education Center and an overview of. We are grateful to the Los Angeles Maryvale Guild for their unwavering commitment to the families we serve.

# Program Updates

### SETON HOUSE

During its first year of operation, Seton House made a substantial impact on

26 families. The Seton House program provides safe, temporary housing for single mothers, empowering them with tools to help change the trajectory of their lives. Maryvale cultivates a compassionate environment where moms can focus on personal development, while learning life skills to sustain positive and productive lifestyles for themselves and their children. Each mother is required to participate in case management, support groups, individual and group therapy, life skills, and parenting training. In addition, they have access to free childcare at our Early Education Center for all age-appropriate children.

## FY 2022-2023 RESULTS:

77% of residents were employed when leaving the program. 64% of residents moved into long-term/permanent housing. 65% of residents completed or furthered their education.

18% have exited to follow-up programs.

To further expand our ability to serve more moms and their families through the Seton House program, Maryvale is converting an existing dorm-style residential building on the main campus into twenty individual family living units, updating kitchens, dining rooms, and creating a less institutional environment. The

renovation of the Laboure building is expected to begin early next year with an anticipated opening in September 2024.

EMBRACING

In his book "Mere Christianity" C.S. Lewis writes "Transitions are not endings, but gateways to new chapters in our lives. In the face of uncertainty, we find strength in embracing the unknown and trusting in our own resilience." This succinctly captures our experience at Maryvale over the past three years. Following the decision to close the residential program with roots back to the original orphanage established by the Daughters of Charity in 1856, we found ourselves in a time of transition, prayer, and ultimately planning for the next chapter in Maryvale's 167-year history.

Our Gateway – Seton House opened successfully in August 2022 and has provided temporary housing for single mothers and their children. One of many impacts this program has accomplished is the integration of all our program services that surround families with the services they need at a critical time in their lives.

In addition to the housing and wraparound services provided to the mothers in the Seton House program, the preschool age children benefit from our Early Childhood Education Center. The children experience a safe and nurturing early learning environment that sets the foundation for their future success. Through our Community-Based Mental Health Services, these families learn to cope with past trauma and the challenges they are facing as they look to brighter futures.

The Seton House program is made possible, in part, through the generous support of the Los Angeles Maryvale Guild.

St. Vincent de Paul reminds us: "God does not consider the outcome of the good work undertaken but the charity that accompanied it."

On behalf of myself, the Daughters of Charity, the Board of Directors, and the Maryvale staff we thank the Guild for the \$500,000 donation for our Capital Campaign to add 20 additional individual living units, as well as the generous ongoing support of the Seton House program. Without your assistance, we would not be able to continue providing a safe, caring, supportive home for the families in Seton House.

We value our continued partnership with The Los Angeles Maryvale Guild in our mission to lift up one individual, one family, one community at a time!


